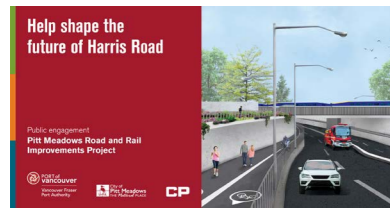

Mayor & Council

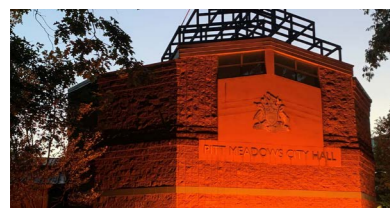
Pitt Meadows Art Gallery

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

The City recognized National Day for Truth and Reconciliation by lighting up City Hall in orange and placing banners at the Pitt Meadows Art Gallery. Residents were encouraged to visit the Place of Reflection located beside the ḱíćáý (Katzie) First Nation flag at ᓄᓂᓂᓂᓂᓂᓂ (Spirit Square) and to reflect on the impacts of residential schools.



Farmer's Market

The City was excited to bring the Farmer's Market back to ᓄᓂᓂᓂᓂᓂᓂ (Spirit Square) from June to September. The market featured fresh produce, small-scale food producers and artisan-made goods, and welcomed over 11,000 attendees with over \$86,000 spent on local goods.



Racquet Court Resurfacing

Earlier this year, the Parks and Recreation department sought feedback from residents on the options for resurfacing the racquet courts at Pitt Meadows Athletic Park. 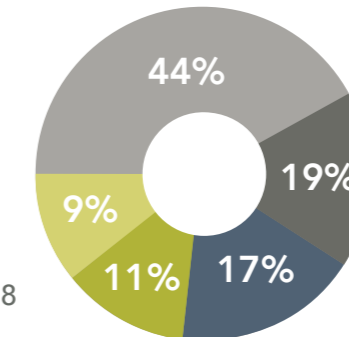

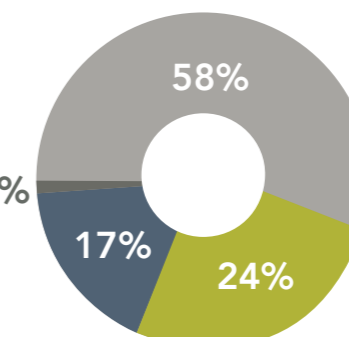
