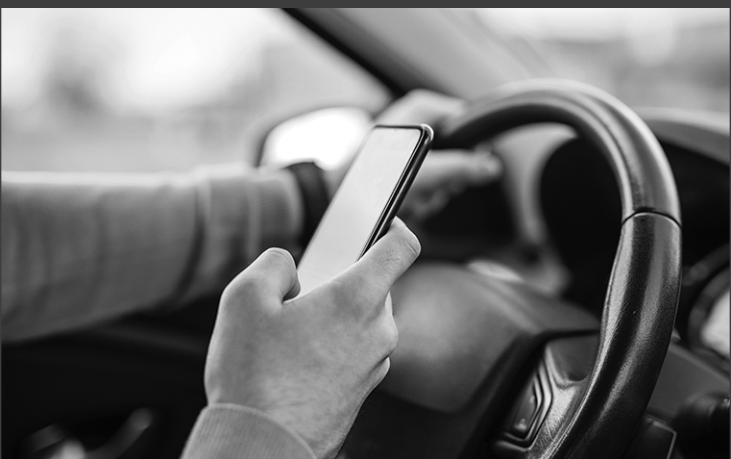


Policing in Pitt Meadows

March is Distracted Driving Month

Distracted driving accounts for more than one in four fatal crashes in B.C. each year. Not only is it dangerous, but the fines for distracted driving can add up quickly.

Even if you're not using your phone, you may still be distracted. Anything that takes your attention away from driving, including eating, drinking, reading, passengers and pets, and playing with your vehicle's gadgets, can contribute to distracted driving.

- Plan your route, secure your pets, and minimize potential distractions before your head out.
- Keep your eyes on the road and hands on the steering wheel.
- Even the sound of an incoming email or text can be distracting; turn off your phone and put it out of reach.
- If you have a Learner's (L) or Novice (N) licence, you are not allowed to use any electronic device at all, including hands-free and GPS.

Remember, road safety is everyone's responsibility.
