### Mayor & Council

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority outlined significant affordability challenges related to the Harris Road Underpass Project and requested that the City become a funding partner and provide 25 percent of costs up to \$49.6 million. Council voted to decline, citing the long-term tax burden. Council continues to proactively advocate for federal funding to help close the funding gap. 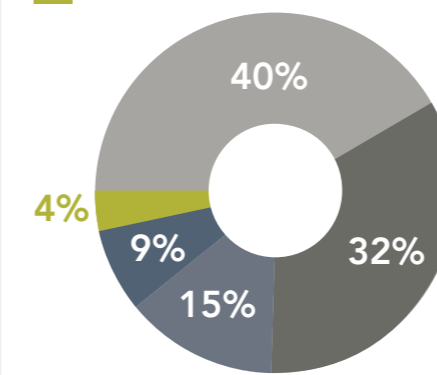

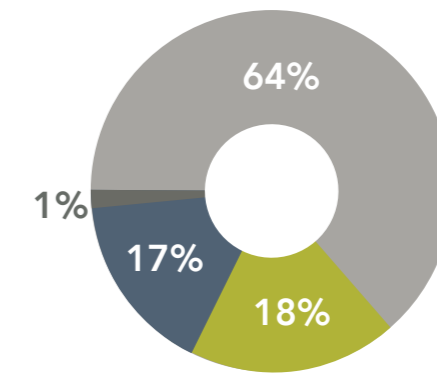
