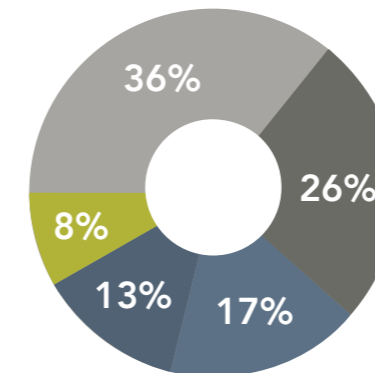

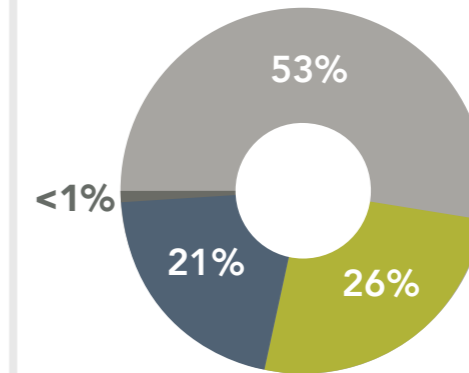

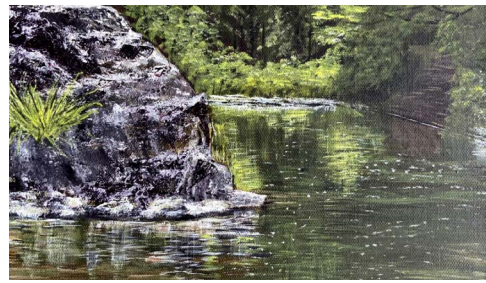

National Day of Awareness for Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women

The City recognized the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit (MMIWG2S) people in Canada, also known as Red Dress Day, with a ceremony in šxʷhékʷnəs (Spirit Square). Red dresses were hung up throughout the square, symbolizing the more than 1,000 lives that have been lost at the hands of violence.
