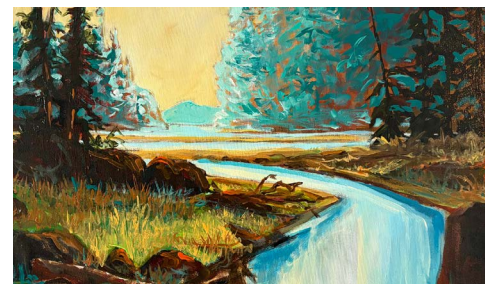
Mayor & Council

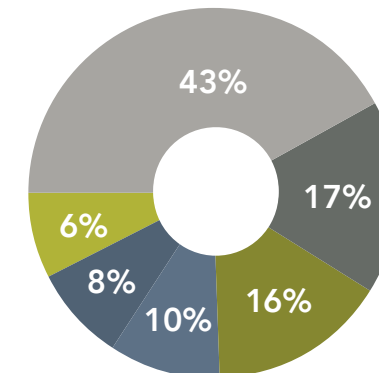

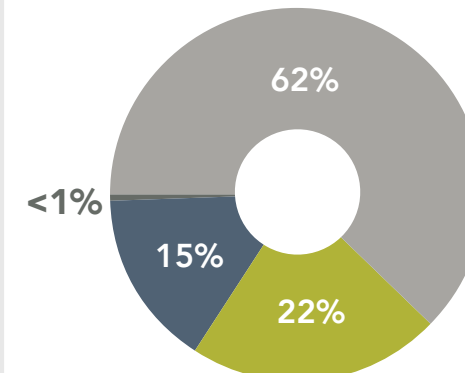
