Council this Month Police Services Review Update

After three years of extensive review, research and consultation, Council approved the transition towards an independent RCMP Detachment in March 2020 in order to provide enhanced police visibility, public safety, service levels and responsiveness in Pitt Meadows. The independent detachment would operate within the existing budget and provide much better service to our unique community and better return on investment. The Feasibility Study completed earlier this year found that the existing Community Policing Office (CPO) does not satisfy the RCMP's criteria for an independent detachment and recommended the Art Gallery/Athletic Building site as the preferred location to build a standalone detachment. The police services building would be funded without a property tax increase and by potential grant money. The Art Gallery will be rehomed to a new, more permanent location; the baseball fields at Harris Road Park will be kept whole and no parking will be lost. Learn more at pittmeadows.ca/policeview.
