Legislative Requirements for Public Consultation

- early and ongoing, and
- specifically consider whether consultation is required with the following:
 - The Greater Vancouver Regional District Board;
 - The City of Port Coquitlam, the City of Maple Ridge, and the Township of Langley;
 - The Katzie First Nation;
 - Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows School District No. 42;
 - Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure;
 - TransLink;
 - Agricultural Land Commission



Why Public Consultation?

- To gain an understanding of the community and its values
- To build an understanding with the community regarding the decisions made in the process of creating the OCP
- To gain a greater acceptance or support for the decisions that are based on the plan moving into the future.






