Civic Elections Take Place Saturday, October 20

The citizens of Pitt Meadows will elect one Mayor, six Councillors, and two School Trustees (for School District No. 42). Those elected will serve a 4-year term commencing November 2018 and ending October 2022. Voting will be held on Oct 20 from 8am until 8pm at Pitt Meadows Family Rec Centre (12027 Harris Road) and Heritage Hall (12460 Harris Road).

Advance Voting will take place at City Hall (12007 Harris Road) from 8am to 8pm on Mon, Oct 1; Wed, Oct 3; Wed, Oct 10; and Fri, Oct 12. Mail ballot voting is available to those who have a physical disability, illness or injury that



affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity, or for those who expect to be absent and unavailable to vote on General Voting Day or on Advance Voting Days. Mail ballots are now available, please contact City Hall.



City Awarded \$678,200 Grant for Flood Protection



The City of Pitt Meadows has been awarded a Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) grant of \$678,200 for pump station generators at five of the City's six flood control pump stations as part of the City's flood protection program. The project begins this fall and is scheduled to complete by July 31, 2020.
