For Domestic Animals



- ☐ Record pet's microchip/tattoo and license ☐ Food, water and treats (including dishes) for numbers. Store with their medical records 1 week (dogs 4 litres, cats 1 litre per day) in your important document file with your ☐ Medications and medical records (include emergency kit vet contact info), plus photos with written descriptions stored in a Ziploc bag ☐ Label all containers with pet names and your contact information ☐ Waste bags for dogs ☐ As many items as possible should be packed ☐ Litter & box for cats (scoop, waste bags) in a grab and go kit. Bedding ☐ Have an emergency plan for all animals and move challenging animals such as birds, ☐ Leashes, harness, muzzles if necessary fish, or exotic animals as soon as possible Pet Carriers ☐ If you have an animals that cannot be moved such as a large aquarium, create a ☐ Toys to help entertain and lower stress sign describing the animals left on the property with your name and contact □ Towels and blankets information ahead of time. Affix to your door to alert rescue officials. ☐ Can opener, spoon, scoop, pet first aid kit, disinfectant for pet mess clean up, paper
 - While in storage, rotate pet food and water every 3 months, replace medications as advised by your vet.
