Changes Planned for COVID-19 Task Forces

The Economic Resiliency Task Force (ERTF) and Community Check-In Task Force (CCITF) were created as temporary initiatives in March in response to the COVID-19 pandemic to support local business and provide services and resources to vulnerable citizens. Council wants to continue these important initiatives by transitioning them into permanent committees. The ERTF will transition to an Economic Development Advisory Committee that will incorporate tourism into its mandate. The CCITF will be transitioned to a Social Planning Advisory Committee that focuses on relationship building and information sharing with local community organizations and agencies. North Lougheed Area Plan Update

On September 15, Council granted first and second reading to the Official Community Plan (OCP) Amendment Bylaw No. 2869 for the North Lougheed Study Area Land Use Plan. The plan and development policies were drafted based on extensive public and stakeholder engagement. The public will be invited to participate and provide feedback at a Public Hearing later this fall. The City will also be engaging with the Agricultural Advisory Committee and other stakeholders as the project proceeds. Independent RCMP Detachment Update

Council and the City are continuing to move forward with its transition plan towards an independent RCMP Detachment in Pitt Meadows. The City is now seeking formal approval from the RCMP Commanding Officer and Provincial Minister. A spatial analysis is also being completed to review the business case to either renovate the existing Community Police Office or build a new standalone detachment.
