The procession began at 10:45am and concluded with a reception in the Pitt Meadows Family Recreation Centre.

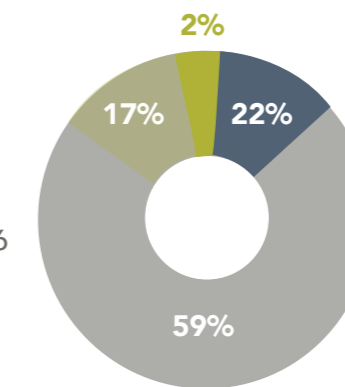
