



Working Towards Enhanced Safety & Accessibility Harris Road Underpass

Pitt Meadows Road and Rail Improvements Project

The Harris Road crossing has been a concern among residents and discussed by City staff and councils since the 1970s. If approved by Council, the Pitt Meadows Road and Rail Improvements Project will eliminate the at-grade crossing at Harris Road by building a four-lane underpass and a shared multi-use path to accommodate various modes of active transportation. This will reduce vehicle emissions and congestion while improving safety, commuting times and emergency response for police, fire and ambulance services.

"The City of Pitt Meadows is working with the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority (port authority) and CP to reduce at-grade rail crossings, which will improve safety and community access by creating more reliable travel times and better emergency response options. Council is committed to appropriate noise and vibration mitigation related to the Road and Rail Improvements Project and to advocate for additional mitigation of existing noise and vibration exceedances, while minimizing construction impacts to businesses and preserving heritage."

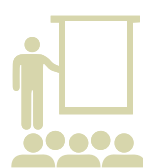
