Always Keep Your Eyes on the Road!

Roughly one in four fatal crashes on B.C. roads involves driver distraction. Not only is it dangerous, but the fines for distracted driving can add up quickly.

Even if you're not using your phone, you may still be distracted. Anything that takes your attention away from driving, like chatting with passengers, eating or drinking, or changing your playlist, can contribute to distracted and inattentive driving.

- Don't use your cellphone at a red light or in traffic.
- Keep your hands off. Hands-free means a Bluetooth, wired headset or speakerphone that can be operated with one touch or voice commands.
- If you have a Learner's (L) or Novice (N) licence, you aren't allowed to use any electronic devices (like phone or GPS) behind the wheel, for any purpose, even in hands-free mode.

We all play a part in making our roads safe – when you're behind the wheel, focus on the road.
