Water Main Flushing

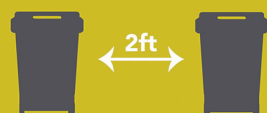


The City of Pitt Meadows Public Works Department will be flushing water mains throughout the municipality until April. During this time there may be a temporary drop in water pressure or a noticeable discoloration in tap water. To correct problems with milky water, open the cold tap slightly to bleed air from the water lines. If you experience problems with dirty water, turn on an outside tap and let it run until the water clears. Thank you to residents for your patience.
